SIC Annual Goals

Goal One: By June 2022, the school will achieve a 10 point increase on each of the following assessment and tools as measured by data from the NWEA District Summary Report and the Annual School Report card: MAP, ACT, EOCEP, ACT WorkKeys and On-Time Graduation Rate.

Goal Two: By June 2022, the school will routinely show exhibits of exemplary literacy practices as measured by the *Read to Succeed Middle and Secondary Exemplary Reflection Tool*.

Goal Three: By June 2022, maintain 100% highly qualified teachers and administrators. The school teachers and the administrators will receive and/or maintain a rating of proficient or exemplary as measured by Assisting, Developing and Evaluating Performance of Teachers (ADEPT) and Assisting, Developing and Evaluating Performance of Principals (ADEPP), respectively.

Goal Four: By June 2022, the percentage of the schools parents/guardians "satisfied with learning environment" will increase from 72.2% to 82.2% (10 Percentage points) as measured by the parent survey data from the Annual School Report Card.

Goal Five: By June 2022, the percentage of the school 'stakeholders (teachers, students and parents) who indicate "satisfaction with the social and physical environment" and "satisfaction with home-school relations" will increase by 10% as measured by the Evaluations From Teachers, 'Students and Parents data on the Annual School Report.

Student Achievements

Currently, CHS has 57 juniors and seniors enrolled in Dual Enrollment at Central Carolina Technical College, as well 13 seniors and 32 juniors enrolled in the Early College Program at USC Sumter.

The following are just a small percentage of the many CHS Points of Pride. Our senior students to date have been awarded \$308,200.00 in scholarship. Our Varsity Girls Basketball Team remains Region VIA Champions for the 8th consecutive year, and two senior accepted scholarships to Winthrop College. In our Spring Semester a FCCLA student became the 1st VP for the State of SC for a 2nd term, and will travel to Nashville, Tennessee this summer to the National FCCLA Leadership Meeting July 2018. FBLA had a student selected for State President for our 2018-2019 school year. Our Chorus had nineteen students that made the SC All-State Chorus. Chamber Choir and the Ladies Ensemble performed at the State Choral Festival and received a Superior Ratings with Distinction for both choirs. Show Choir entered the Festive Five at the Sumter Mall and won. Additionally, six boys were selected to attend Palmetto Boys State this year, and two girls were selected for Palmetto Girls State and two alternates.

Any successes that CHS has achieved could not have been accomplished without the support of our stakeholders, and we sincerely thank you for all you have done.
